LOCAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

Water is a necessity that sadly is in short supply for many people worldwide. Many people in this community are suffering from disease due to contaminated water sources. Miombo Safaris has assisted by donating medicines to this community. The lack of wells in this area means that villagers are obliged to get their water from the rivers, the habitat of crocodiles.



This water pump was installed many years ago, but has not worked for more than 10 years. Miombo Safaris have conducted surveys in many villages and will begin renovating wells such as this.

In 2003 Miombo Safaris received a water-drilling rig. We have trained a team to operate this equipment, which is portable and therefore can be transported into remote areas where water wells are badly needed. With the trained crew Miombo has already drilled several water wells in some very remote areas, where previously there were no wells at all.

Education—the corner-stone of life. This school has 450 pupils and only seven teachers. Miombo Safaris has donated cement and iron sheets to assist in building more classrooms and financial assistance to the school to help their efforts in upgrading the facilities. Medical attention for this community is many miles away, since their own dispensary has never been fully completed.

In 2003 Miombo Safaris donated 5.4 million Tanzanian Shillings worth of sulphur to villages in the Lukwika/Lumesule area to assist villagers in combating disease in their cashew nut trees.

ANTI-POACHING

Poaching is a sad reality, one we must face on a daily basis in all of our areas. In order to conserve wildlife, firm, all-year-round measures need to be taken to combat poaching. Our joint Wildlife Division and Company anti-poaching teams work continuously to protect the wildlife resources in our concessions.

Our costly anti-poaching efforts are funded by revenue generated from our hunting clients which assist us with the costs of staff, vehicles, fuel, food rations, equipment, allowances, rewards, G.P.S., radios and various other related expenses. When you hunt with Miombo Safaris, you are directly funding long term conservation efforts.

Our aim is to conserve Tanzania's wildlife by effectively managing its precious resources in order that our children and theirs will be able to enjoy the natural heritage of Africa...wildlife.
