JAGUAR PROJECT

The Faro Moro Project is the first phase of a Paraguay jaguar conservation program. It is a joint program between the Paraguay Ministry of Environment, Conservation Force and FARO MARO Eco Research Foundation. The conservation strategy is to structure the sustainable use of jaguar to provide income for landholders, revenue for management, positive incentives and critical habitat.



The program is designed to provide the following benefits:

- Determine the range, density, and number of jaguar in the Chaco;
- Provide revenue for management;
- Provide income to landholders;
- Create landholder tolerance of jaguar;
- Keep existing jaguar habitat intact;
- Recreate jaguar habitat and corridors through easements and set asides;
- Restore the jaguar prey base;
- Insure the long term survival of jaguar and bio-diversity of Paraguay.

The Chaco is renowned for having the largest subspecies of jaguar and large tracts of intact jaguar habitat. The purpose of the project is to secure that habitat for the long term survival of the jaguar.



Live Capture

You can personally help insure the survival of the largest cat in the America's. Contributors are invited to participate in the darting and collaring of a jaguar. Experience the adventure of a lifetime. Know the jaguar and the sights, sounds and smells of his wild world. All but 25% of the donation is tax deductible.

Track a Jaguar
